Similarly with the Department of Defence Production aiming for 90000 Crore Defence Production for the current year, here too there is tremendous scope for Indian Industries.

INDIAN DEFENCE INDUSTRY

India's defence manufacturing sector has been witnessing a CAGR of 3.9% be-tween 2016 and 2020. The Indian government has set the defence production target at US\$ 25.00 billion by 2025 (including US\$ 5 billion from exports by 2025). Defence exports in India were estimated to be at US\$ 1.29 billion in 2019-20. India's defence import value stood at US\$ 463 million for Fy20 and is expected to be at US\$ 469.5 million in Fy21 Defence export in the country witnessed strong growth in the last two years. India targets to export military hardware worth US\$ 5 Billion (Rs. 35,000 crore) in the next 5 years.

As of 2019, India ranked 19th in the list of top defence exporters in the world by exporting defence products to 42 countries.

- The Government of India has allocated Rs 26,275 Crore for Modernization of Police & Central Armed Paramilitary Forces.
- India is the second largest defence importer behind Saudi Arabia making up 9.2% of global arms import.
- India still largest arms importer, spent more than \$100 billion in last 10 years: SIPRI
- India is upgrading forces by heavily buying of Modern Weapons, Ammunition, Rifles, Sniper Rifles, Communication, Missile Systems, Warning and Radar Systems etc.
