### **Budget 2024 | What does the manufacturing sector expect from it**

Date: July 18, 2024

**Keyword: Manufacturing Sector** 

National Democratic Alliance (NDA) 3.0 government is set to present its first Budget, and the manufacturing sector is a key area of focus. This sector is crucial to the Indian economy, accounting for 17% of GDP and generating significant employment. The government's "Make in India" initiative, which includes the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, has demonstrably helped grow the economy. Industry leaders are calling for bold new initiatives in the upcoming budget to maintain this momentum and make India self-sufficient ("Atma Nirbhar"). A key demand is the extension of PLI schemes to new sectors, especially those with high labour intensity and connections to small and medium businesses, such as toys, footwear, furniture, e-bicycle, jewellery, and handicrafts. The government may also consider PLI for components in industries such as electronics, advanced chemistry cell, semiconductor, etc to boost domestic production and reduce reliance on cheap imports.

## <u>China's aluminium extrusion exports maintain a growing trend in H1 driven by higher overseas premiums</u>

Keyword: Aluminium Extrusion

From January to June 2024, China's aluminium extrusion export totalled 520,100 tonnes, up 11.61 per cent year-on-year. This increase is attributed to stronger overseas aluminium prices compared to domestic metals. Additionally, as the implementation of US sanctions on Chinese aluminium-extruded products is nearing, scheduled for Q4 2024, many companies are stocking up in advance, pushing up aluminium extrusion export orders in Liaoning and Hunan provinces. Among the top Chinese aluminium extrusion exporting provinces, Guangdong, Shandong, and Jiangsu topped the list, accounting for 53.28 per cent, 12.69 per cent, and 7.07 per cent, respectively. Among the export destinations, Vietnam led the way, accounting for 7.21 per cent of China's total exports, followed by the Philippines with 4.83 per cent, and Australia with 4.81 per cent.

## **Budget 2024-25: Decoding The Big Manufacturing Push**

Manufacturing is at the top in the central government's list of priorities, as evidenced by finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman's Union Budget 2024-25 speech. A number of measures were announced — from a reduction in basic customs duty for inputs and raw material to incentives around job-creation — that should ideally further prop up the already-booming manufacturing industry. The customs duty exemption will in particular reduce costs related to manufacturing mobile phones, lithium-based batteries for consumer electronics devices, electric vehicles (EVs), drones as well as the other focus areas such as space tech and semiconductors. Speaking with Inc42, 3one4 Capital's Pranav Pai said that the government support to the homegrown manufacturing sector has addressed a significant barrier to growth. Hence, it eradicates reasons for investors who were hesitant about opportunities in India's manufacturing ecosystem.

## <u>Budget 2024: From solar to thermal power, Sitharaman announces many measures for energy sector</u>

In the interim budget, the finance minister had announced the PM Surya Ghar Yojana with a cost outlay of Rs 75,021 crore. The scheme aims to power 10 million households and create 17 lakh direct jobs across the solar value chain. It is also expected to add 30 GW of solar capacity and reduce 720 million tonnes of CO2 equivalent. Presenting the Union Budget 2024-25 on Tuesday, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said the scheme has generated remarkable response with over 1.28 crore registrations and 14 lakh applications. The scheme will further provide free electricity up to 300 units to 1 crore households in the country. She also announced new measures and policies around pumped storage, nuclear and thermal power plants.

NITI Aayog has identified red mud as a potential source of scandium, a critical mineral for advanced aluminum alloys used in defense, aerospace, and automotive industries.

Anti-dumping: DGTR proposes up to \$577 per tonne duty on aluminium frame imports for solar panels from China

DGTR has recommended anti-dumping duty of up to \$577 per tonne for five years on imports of aluminium frames for solar panels from China. The probe was carried out through the Directorate

General of Trade Remedies (DGTR), which is the investigative arm of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. n its final findings document, the DGTR concluded that aluminium frames were exported to India at a price below the normal value, resulting in dumping. "The dumping margin is not only above de-minimis level but substantial also," it noted. It added that the dumping of the goods materially retarded the establishment of the domestic industry in India. While the volume of imports increased even after the commencement of commercial production in India.

Budget 2024 missed opportunity green hydrogen, say experts

India's Union Budget 2024-25 lacked significant new measures to support the green hydrogen sector, with industry experts noting that the absence of initiatives in the full budget represents a missed opportunity despite the green molecule's growing importance in global energy strategies. According to Vineet Bhatia, executive director, Grant Thornton Bharat, India's fiscal support under NGHM for green hydrogen and its derivatives are creating an initial ecosystem for establishing the market, however, there is a necessity to provide additional support. "Support such as including tax holiday or concessional corporate tax, additional fiscal support for production of green molecules, and electrolyzer manufacturing which would increase India's competitiveness in the global platform and counter the green subsidies offered by global counterparts," he said.

[29/07/24, 10:04:31 AM] Harshit Sharma: In its latest report titled "Outlook on Emerging Markets," the global firm recognised India's strong demographic dividend, and said that the country will reap the benefit of its younger population, helping it to drive growth until 2060. "With a young and growing labour force--nearly 80 per cent of its population is under the age of 50--and a rising middle class with real wage growth, India has a demographic dividend tailwind, in our view, and the country is projected to grow quickly until the 2060s," the report stated.
